Introduction

Victor William Bone started working for Ransomes, Sims & Jefferies in the late 1890's. From around 1907 until 1914 he travelled extensively to promote the company going to Serbia, Egypt, Russia, Rumania, Denmark and other countries. His travelling was curtailed by the outbreak of World War I and in 1921 he became a non-executive director at Ruston & Hornsby Ltd.
