



PLAYING AT FARMING

A new exhibition of items drawn from the Peter Wade-Martins Collection of Farm Toys





These toy farm vehicles and implements are from a collection assembled over the last 20 years by Peter Wade-Martins. This is just a small selection of many hundreds of different British-made horse- and tractor-drawn implements. It is one of the most comprehensive collections of its kind and covers all known UK manufacturers, materials, and types of machine that were made.

All the large-scale farm technologies in the Museum are reproduced here at a smaller scale. There are also toy versions of things that the Museum doesn't have. For example, there is no full-size combine harvester in the Museum's galleries. Toy examples can help show the development of such machines.

As this display reveals, many kinds of equipment were recreated in toy form. As well as modern-style tractors, there were also traction engines and crawlers. Other technologies made in miniature included wagons, carts, trailers, ploughs, harrows, hay rakes, hay loaders, and the ever-popular combine harvester.

This collection covers most of the different materials used to recreate farm machines in miniature. In this selection alone you can see lead, wood, tinplate, leather, Bakelite, rubber, and plastic. Lots of these examples still retain their original packaging. The images on toy boxes reveal a great deal about how the countryside was represented during the twentieth century.

These toys showcase the companies that helped children to become 'carpet farmers.' From the first UK-made toy tractor of the 1920s to the many later plastic playsets, they show how the toy industry reflected changes on the farm. By 1980 most toy manufacturers had moved their operations overseas.

Many of these toys present an evocative sense of childhood and nostalgia for old rural ways. In this way they echo themes that play a major part in the presentation of technical change in twentieth-century farming. The scope of this collection stops in 1980, when UK-based manufacturing ceased, but 'carpet farming' remains popular to this day.

Following the generous gift of the Peter Wade-Martins Collection of Farm Toys to the University of Reading in 2019, the Museum has begun carefully conserving and cataloguing each individual artefact. Watch this space for future displays showing different selections of objects from this amazing resource.


